The events of August 10 will celebrate the second anniversary of the signing of the **Memorandum of Understanding** between six scientific institutions: the Marine Biological Laboratory, the Northeast Fisheries Science Center Woods Hole Laboratory, Sea Education Association, the United States Geological Survey-Woods Hole, the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution, and the Woods Hole Research Center. The Memorandum states that these institutions will work together to create “**pathways of opportunity.**” These pathways will be designed to attract people of underrepresented groups to Woods Hole by showcasing opportunities in the scientific and educational community from primary education through higher education, post graduate work, research, and lifetime careers.
