The 2012 Program consists of a four-week course (June 1 through July 1) and a six-week internship working on a research project (ending August 10). The course and the internship are both in Woods Hole. Students are expected to complete both the course and the internship.

PEP is designed for college students (priority given to rising juniors and seniors) with a major in the natural sciences (biology, chemistry, physics, mathematics, engineering, or geosciences and earth system sciences) who have had some course work in oceanography, biology, or marine and/or environmental science.

To ensure that your application is complete, be sure to also submit via mail a copy of **1) a resume, 2) official college transcripts, and 3) two letters of reference**. Alternately, you may submit a completed application via e-mail or U.S. mail. Applications received by February 15 will get priority consideration for funding.
